Dawn Pettus, PharmD, BCACP is the Pharmacy Manager for Triad HealthCare Network, the largest Accountable Care Organization in North Carolina. She graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill with a BS Pharmacy degree and a Pharm.D. degree. She completed a PGY1 residency at the Medical Center in Columbus Georgia. Cone Health Heart Failure Clinic Preceptor- Erika Nicolsen, PharmD, BCPS, CPP

Erika Nicolsen, PharmD, BCPS, CPP graduated from UNC Eshelman School of Pharmacy in 2014 and completed both her Acute Care PGY1 and Cardiology Pharmacy PGY2 at Moses Cone Memorial Hospital. During her PGY2, she researched the impact of a medication change teaching tool and standardized pharmacist discharge reconciliation program on limiting medication errors for heart failure patients. The outcomes of this project were presented in April at the American College of Cardiology 65th Annual Scientific Session and Expo in Chicago It will also be presented at the Institute for Healthcare Improvement in December. She currently works as a clinical pharmacist practitioner at the Cone Health Advanced Heart Failure Clinic. Her responsibilities include completing medication reconciliations, ensuring medication access for uninsured or underinsured patients and those requiring prior authorizations, patient education, warfarin dosing for left ventricular assist device patients as well as assisting with clinical heart failure research through the Cardiovascular Research Foundation. She is currently in the process of establishing a pharmacist medication titration visit to assist in the optimization of goal-directed heart failure medication therapies with the goal of reducing hospitalizations and mortality.
